

ESTABLISHING A NEW PROGRAM ENTITLED
"DEVELOPMENT OF TAX ACQUIRED PROPERTY"
IN THE COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT PROGRAM FUND

BE IT ORDERED by the City Council of the City of Waterville,
acting as the municipal officers as follows:

THAT proceeds received from the sale of tax acquired
property shall first be applied to the unpaid taxes, interest and
costs accrued on the property; and

BE IT FURTHER ORDERED THAT any excess proceeds from the sale
shall be transferred directly to the "Development of Tax Acquired
Property" program in the Community Development Program Fund; and

BE IT FURTHER ORDERED THAT the proceeds will be used on any
tax acquired property to cover such expenses or costs, including
but not limited to, demolition, renovation, repair, securing of
property and other costs that the City Council deems necessary to
rehabilitate the property.


