## Free Oral Cancer Screening

According to the American Cancer Society, about 35,000 Americans will get oral cancer this year.

Risk factors include tobacco and alcohol use and human papilloma virus (HPV) infection.

### The most common symptoms of oral cancer are:

- sores and ulcers in the mouth that do not heal.
- pain in the mouth that doesn't go away.

### Early detection of oral cancer can save your life.

### Free oral health screening takes about five minutes.

- The screenings are done by a dentist, and staff can help refer you to further care if needed.
- A dentist will look in your mouth, ears and nose and checking for lumps in your neck.

**MaineGeneral Medical Center and Inland Hospital health educators** also will be on hand to give you information on topics such as quitting tobacco and improving your nutrition and physical activity.

Space is limited. An appointment is strongly recommended, but walk-ins are welcome.
